Title (of the Motion)	Motion for the Protection of the Macedonian Identity in EU and Candidate States

Text of the motion: (In English; Maximum 600 words)

- a. Considering the report on "Minimum standards for minorities in the EU" from (2018/2036(INI))
- b. Considering the fact that the Macedonians are indigenous people on the territory of Bulgaria and Albania and display distinctive cultural traits, maintain long-term and loyal ties to the state and are sufficiently representative although smaller in number as than the rest of the population of that state;
- c. Considering foremost that the Macedonians are **strongly motivated** to preserve that which constitutes their common identity, including their culture, their traditions and their Macedonian language;
- d. Considering that the Macedonians fulfill the criteria for a minority according to the aforementioned EU-Report;
- e. Considering that, Macedonians are subject of state organized systematic policies of assimilation, discrimination and denial of their human and minority rights;

EFA condemns:

- The Bulgarian policy of denying the existence of the Macedonian nation and blocking Macedonia's EU membership;
- The Bulgarian policy of assimilating and discriminating against the Macedonian minority in Bulgaria;
- The Bulgarian policy of ethnically targeting the Macedonian minority in Albania to artificially create a Bulgarian minority through the mass granting and selling of Bulgarian EU citizenships, assimilation efforts, pressure on the authorities, and financial inducements a clear abuse of Bulgaria's EU membership.
- Further the leveraged use of this recently created minority to blackmail Albania and legitimize the assimilation of the Macedonian minority.
- The legal proceedings supported by the Bulgarian state against the Macedonian Alliance for European Integration, which aims to silence the political voice of the Macedonian minority in Albania.
- The issuance of false certificates of Bulgarian origin by certain Albanian



municipalities—despite having no legal jurisdiction to issue such documents—for the purpose of acquiring Bulgarian passports through corrupt means.

The European Free Alliance calls for:

From Bulgaria:

- To abandon its conditions for Macedonia's European integration which are contrary to the Copenhagen criteria, and to lift the blockade on Macedonia's EU accession;
- To grant the Macedonians in Bulgaria the same rights it demands for the Bulgarians in Macedonia, in accordance with the principles of justice and equality;
- To immediately stop its aggression against the Macedonian minority in Albania;
- Together with Greece and Albania, to sign and fully implement the **European Charter for Regional or Minority Languages**, including active support for the Macedonian language and culture for the Macedonian and other minorities.

From the EU institutions:

- To reopen the minority issue in the post-monitoring process for Bulgaria and ensure full compliance with the Copenhagen criteria;
- For the European Commission to investigate the treatment of the Macedonian minorities in Bulgaria, Albania, and Greece;
- To require that future EU texts explicitly reference the "ethnic Macedonian minority" in the main body, not in footnotes or vague terms;
- To create mechanisms allowing minorities to compel EU institutions like the EU Commission to act on systemic rights violations;
- To treat ECtHR precedent equally and not use it to justify inaction, especially where minorities lack legal resources;
- To recognise the Macedonian language as a minority language and support its institutional use;
- To acknowledge that registration requirements to access EU funded grants deny Macedonian EU citizens equal access;
- To urge the European Commission to review and remove registration requirements for grant applications for the aforementioned reason;
- To guarantee the right to self-determination and self-expression for Macedonians in both Bulgaria and Albania.

Reasoning:

This motion draws on the EU Report on Minimum Standards for Minorities (2018/2036(INI)) and responds to the rising suppression of Macedonian identity in Bulgaria and Albania, and the EU's failure to explicitly mention the ethnic Macedonian minority. A new approach is needed to ensure visibility and inclusion within the EU's human rights framework.
