Title (of the Motion)	Motion for a new funding system for the regions in the Spanish State

Spain should reform its funding system for its regions in light of financial justice.

- a) Considering that last March marked the 44th anniversary of the creation of the Consell del País Valencià, a shared effort in which the whole of society was involved and which led to the Statute of Autonomy, approved in 1982, which allowed the recovery of the ability of Valencians to decide their future.
- b) Considering that four decades later we are in a vulnerable time for the Valencian people since none of the financing systems has treated the Valencian country fairly.
- c) Considering that each Valencian receives 215 euros less than the Spanish average, 703 less than the best-funded autonomous community, which is equivalent to between 10% and 29% less resources, respectively, and that this blocks their ability to generate wealth, well-being and progress.
- d) Considering that the Valencian people are asking for a correction of this underfunding, and that if this correction were made, the Valencian Country would receive additional revenue of 1,325 million euros per year.
- e) Considering that Valencians are in an unusual situation, mainly because they have a per capita income 12 points lower than average and yet the Valencian Country is the territory that receives the fewest resources per inhabitant; the only one that, despite being poor, contributes to the whole state.
- f) Considering that back in 2013 the Commission of Experts for the Design of a New Model noted that the problem dates back to the beginning of regional funding systems.
- g) Considering that as a people we have a duty to fully achieve the rights recogniz\sed in the Constitution and in our Statute of Autonomy.

Valencians are living a historic moment in which we can put an end to discrimination, to move towards a more prosperous, more social and fairer society. The result is unbearable for Valencian citizens. Faced with this prolonged discrimination, the European Free Alliance calls for:

1. An immediate reform of the financing system that establishes a new model with sufficient resources evenly distributed among all the autonomous communities, that enables Valencians to have decent fundamental public services and to exercise our own competences.
